Mark, who hits mammoth home runs with a refined, compact swing, had one of the finest rookie seasons in 1987 of any ballplayer who ever lived. He led the majors in homers and slugging most of the year and was an easy choice for A.L. Rookie of the Year. Mark, a big man with an easy disposition, broke the 57-year old major league rookie record of 38 home runs in mid-August, and earlier in the season, set a rookie mark with five homers in two successive games. "Mac comes across very stable, very confident," says manager Tony LaRussa. "His even temperament is what makes him different from so many rookies."

Mark was College Player of the Year in '84 when he led the NCAA with 32 homers in his junior year at USC. He played on the '84 Olympic team after being drafted by the A's and, in '85, tied for the lead in home runs and RBIs in the Class A California League. "He's special in a lot of the ways Jose Canseco is special," adds LaRussa. "When you can reach the fences anywhere in the park, that's Reggie-kind of power."
